We recommend you wear long pants, sturdy shoes, hat, and sunscreen. Please bring water bottles, gloves and friends. We will supply tools, extra gloves, extra water, drinks & snacks.

Special presentation about Ironwood Forest National Monument herpetology (reptiles & amphibians) from 10 am to 11am by Royce Ballinger & Young Cage of Marana.

### Directions to El Cerrito Represso:

From Marana - Exit I-10 at Cortaro Rd, follow Cortaro West until it turns into Ina, continue West, then go South on Wade, follow Wade until it turns into Picture Rocks, take Picture Rocks to Sandario Rd, take Sandario South to Manville Rd, follow Manville West to the project site, about 2 miles past the entrance sign to the Monument.

From Tucson - take Speedway Blvd West to Kinney Rd – same route as going to the Arizona Sonora Desert Museum, go West on Mile Wide Rd to Sandario Rd, North on Sandario to Manville Rd, follow Manville West to the project site, about 2 miles past the entrance sign to the Monument. Approximate driving time from Central Tucson is 45 minutes.
